TOUR OVER VIEW

We will start at Dawson Creek , BC and go up the Alaska Highway [Alcan Hwy]
thru Watson Lake and Whitehorse to Fairbanks, Alaska.
From Fairbanks we will go to Denali National Park.
From Denali we go to Palmer and take the Glen highway to Glenn Allen and then Down
the Richardson highway to Valdez , Alaska for a full days cruise to two Glaciers.
From Valdez we will return to Tok , and take the " Top of the World" highway thru
Chicken , Alaska and on to Dawson City , Yukon.
From Dawson City we will go down the Klondike Highway thru Whitehorse to Skagway ,
Alaska.
After our all day trip to Juneau we return up the Klondike Highway to Carcross , Yukon,
and cross over to the Alaska Highway for our return to Dawson Creek.
In all the trip will cover 33 days of excitement and sight seeing that you will remember
for ever.
In all you will cross the USA / Canada Border 6 times on your total trip.

WELCOME TO ALASKA / YOKON , KLONDIKE GOLD / GLACIER CARAVAN

This Travel Guide is to provide you with an overview , on a Daily Basis , what the Caravan will cover. There is room on each page for your notes.

The Travel is arranged so that you will see some of the most magnificent scenery in the world.

Caravanning is a great way to travel , however , it is different than traveling alone. We try to assist our caravaners, in need ,and lookout for each other , on the caravan, so that everyone has a great experience . Remember “ do unto others as you would have them do unto you.”

Your Tour Co-ordinator's are here to answer your questions as the trip progresses.

For ease of travel it is recommended that each coach obtain your own personal copy of the book “ The Milepost” which can be obtained at most book stores. It also has a great map covering the areas that we will be traveling thru .

Everyone on the trip is solely responsible for themselves and their actions.

Everyone is expected to obey all traffic laws and rules of the road.

It is recommended that you travel with your headlights on. Most places it is required.

You should have your own RV Emergency Towing Insurance and Motorhome Insurance that is valid in both the USA and Canada. Be sure to bring the insurance cards along . If you have a breakdown or accident you will be glad you have it.

If you have, or can get, a CB Radio bring it along as that is the best way to communicate while traveling. We will use Chanel 23.

Each evening , when possible , we will have a get together at the Co-Ordinator's coach at 5:30 PM, to discuss the days activities and plan for the next days adventures.

Be sure to have a current Passport and secondary photo ID.

Check to see if your health insurance is good in Canada.

Carry NO guns!

Alcoholic beverages and Tobacco are limited in Canada and will be checked on at the Borders.

PURCHASES

Banks are a good place to exchange US dollars for Canadian dollars.

It is good to carry some US cash. Canada wants to limit the amount you carry to \$5000.

Most credit cards are valid in Canada and are a good way to keep track of your expenses.

FUELING YOUR COACH

You should re-fuel anytime your fuel gage gets to the 1/2 point as fuel stops can be far apart at times. Always try to start the day with a full tank.

PRIOR TO DEPARTURE FROM HOME

It is recommended that you take your Born Free to a good tire shop and have them check your tires for condition and tire pressure.

It is suggested that you carry a 1/2 tank of fresh water.

Do you have clothes for Hot and Cold Weather?

Has your coach been serviced?

Do you have your Passports? Are they current?

Do you have your Cell Phone activated for use in Canada?

Is your Propane tank full?

Check your batteries.

Do you have your Insurance papers?

CARAVAN OPERATIONS

For ease of travel it is suggested that we break into 3 or more groups for travel. It won't be mandatory to stay in a Group but it is nice to be able to look after each other.

Departure from a tour stop, should be in group order. at about 5 minute intervals so not to plug up the roads. This way when we stop at a view point etc. we will have plenty of parking room.

PETS

If you have a pet be sure to check with your Veterinarian as to what shots are required and make sure you have proof of same.

Included in the Caravan are 3 long day tours that pets cannot go on. They will have to stay in your Born Free all day unless you make other arrangements.

RV PARKS

In both Alaska and Canada most RV Parks do not have " Full Hook-ups" however most do have electric and water. Most have a sewer dump.

FRUIT & VEGETABLES

Canada is very strict on taking fruit and vegetables into Canada. Bananas are OK.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Be sure to look over this Travel Guide prior to starting on the Caravan Adventure and bring up any questions that you may have.

From time to time we may want to have a Pot Luck or other dinners together , other than those included in the Caravan Fee. We can discuss that at our Daily get togethers.

NOW lets have a Great Caravan and safe travels and enjoy the " Last Frontier ".

AFTER THE CARAVAN

After we get back to Dawson Creek and you head home you may want to consider going to Grand Prairie and take Hwy. 40 over the mountains to Hinton, then West to Jasper National Park . From there you can go down the Glacier Hwy. [Hwy. 93] past Lake Louise to Banff.

This trip down the Glacier Hwy. is very interesting and well worth the time.

From Banff you can go East thru Calgary and then South to Fort Macleod on Hwy. 2. From there take the road thru Cardston and cross back into the USA near Glacier National Park.
